

The Eagle River Institute of Orthodox Christian Studies began in 1995. Sponsored by Saint John Orthodox Cathedral, it is held each summer August 1-5, and offers sixteen hours of college-level instruction in a variety of Orthodox topics, including Theology, History, Liturgy, Spirituality, and Scriptural Studies. While the primary aim of the Institute is to offer ongoing Christian instruction to Orthodox Christians in Alaska, it is also open to any who wish to attend, and each year the Institute has been enriched by those who have travelled from outside of the state to attend.

Saint John Orthodox Cathedral is part of the Antiochian Orthodox Christian Archdiocese in North America. The Cathedral and 55 acres of church land are situated at the base of the Chugach Mountains, 12 miles outside Anchorage, Alaska's largest city. The facilities of the Cathedral include Saint John Orthodox Christian School, the Saint James House, and Saint Sergius of Radonezh Chapel. The sessions of the Institute are structured so as to allow time during the day for those who wish to take advantage of local attractions such as hiking, fishing, or sightseeing.

Lodging, meals, and transportation are the responsibility of the participants. Anchorage International Airport is a 45-minute drive from Eagle River. In addition to the many hotels in Anchorage, Eagle River has a Microtel Inn (907.622.6000) and several fine restaurants in the downtown area. Father Philip LeMasters is Professor of Religion and Director of the Honors Program at McMurry University in Abilene, Texas, where he is also the pastor of St. Luke's Antiochian Orthodox Church. He is the author of several books in the area of moral theology, most recently *The Forgotten Faith: Ancient Insights for Contemporary Believers from Eastern Christianity*. He was an adjunct professor of Christian Ethics at St. Vladimir's Seminary in 2016-17 and has been a participant at recent, international Orthodox consultations. A graduate of Baylor University and Rice University, he holds a Ph.D. in Christian Theology and Ethics from Duke University and an M.A. in Applied Orthodox Theology from the University of Balamand.

Susan Ashbrook Harvey, PhD

Dr. Susan Ashbrook Harvey is Professor of Religious Studies at Brown University (USA). She specializes in Syriac and Byzantine Christianity. She is also a tonsured chanter at St. Mary's Antiochian Orthodox Church in Pawtucket, Rhode Island. Professor Harvey's scholarship ranges widely across issues of women and gender, embodiment, and lay piety - studied in contexts of asceticism, Bible, hagiography, liturgy, hymnography, domestic and civic religion. Most recently she is a co-author of the book *Jacob of Serug's Homilies on Women Who Met Jesus*. She is a graduate of Grinnell College, Iowa, and holds an M.Litt. and Ph.D. in Byzantine Studies from Birmingham University, England.
