THE SYNAXARION



Palm Sunday

On this day in the Holy Orthodox Church, the Sunday of Palms, we celebrate the radiant and glorious festival of the Entrance of our Lord Jesus Christ into Jerusalem.

Verses

He Who stretches out the firmament and sat on the foal,

Seeks to release mortals from their sinful passions.

Jesus came to Bethany on the Sunday before the six days of the Mosaic Passover. On the following day He sent out two of His Disciples, who brought Him a donkey on which He sat to

enter the city. And when the great multitude heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they immediately took palm branches in their hands and went out to meet Him. They all cried, "Hosanna! Blessed is He Who comes in the Name of the Lord, the King of Israel!" The branches of palm trees were a symbol of Christ's victory over Satan and Death. And "Hosanna" means "We pray You, save us!" The donkey's colt, which was still an untamed animal and impure according to the law, as well as Christ's sitting on it, symbolizes the former barbarity and impurity of the Gentiles; and the subsequent taming of them and their obedience to the holy law of the Gospel.

By Your ineffable compassion, O Christ our God, make us victors over the worldly passions, and make us worthy to see Your glorious victory over death, and Your radiant and lifebearing Resurrection, and have mercy on us. Amen.
