

## Forgiveness Sunday Vespers Sunday, March 17, at 6:15pm

Forgiveness Sunday Vespers brings us into to the journey of Lent. The altar cloths are changed from gold to purple, the lights are dimmed and the music changes. We take this journey as individuals, but also as a community together.

After the Vespers service we will ask forgiveness of one another as we have learned and done for many years, and as it is prescribed in the Lenten service books. There will be children's activities after Vespers, during the forgiveness time, for children ages preschool through 5th grade. Parents can keep their children with them, if they prefer, using their own discretion to facilitate this with other adults. More details about these activities will be posted or announced after the Vespers.

#### TO BE READ FROM THE PULPIT AND PRINTED IN THE BULLETIN

Beloved Hierarchs, Clergy, and Faithful of our Arc hdiocese,

Greetings in the name of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ!

During this holy season of repentance, we strive with renewed focus to live rightly, being "doers of the word and not just hearers" (James 1:22). Along with increasing our prayers and abandoning self-indulgence, we especially focus on caring for the needs of others. As we hear on Meatfare Sunday, we will be judged by God on how we have responded to the sufferings of the "least of these" (Matthew 25), so we must strive to give attention to their needs as we would to Christ's.

Although our Lord Jesus Christ taught and exemplified this law of love in the most perfect way, it is also beautifully stated in the Old Law, where God commands, "If one of your brothers happens to be in need..., you will not harden your heart nor shut your hand to your needy brother. You will surely open your hands to him" (Deuteronomy 15:7–8). Such giving is not just some humanitarian project but a relational act: opening our hearts and hands to our brothers and sisters. It is a determination to actually see the hom cless woman we pass on the street and to remember the friend or acquaintance who has fallen on hard times. Although the magnitude of suffering in the world tempts us to insulate ourselves against the needs of others, the law of love reminds us that each person is a treasure and that his need is not a problem but an opportunity to embrace him.

As we have for 50 years now, we again encourage yo u to open your hearts and hands to the needy by contributing to our Food for Hungry People program this Lent. We appeal to your well-known generosity and ask the blessing of Almighty God on all who participate in this worthy effort.



### Forgiveness Sunday – 4<sup>th</sup> PreLent

On March 17, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Venerable Alexios the "Man of God"; Patrick, bishop of Armagh and enlightener of Ireland; Venerable Theosteriktos the Confessor of the Pelecete Monastery; and Venerable Makarios of Kalyazin.

Also, on this day, we commemorate the exile of the first created Adam, from the Paradise of delight.







Let the world, today along with ages past, mourn bitterly; As by giving in to sweet desires, it has fallen along with mankind.

It is the Sunday of Forgiveness, known also as Cheese Fare Sunday. Today's lesson from the Holy Gospel teaches us about forgiveness and fasting, and how both are crucial to our own return to Paradise. The divine Fathers also set the remembrance of Adam's exile from Paradise on this day, at the beginning of Great Lent, to show us by word and deed how great the benefit

is that man gains from fasting and repenting; and, on the contrary, how great the harm is that comes from destructive gluttony and from disobedience to the divine commandments. The sin of gluttony resulted in Adam and Eve's banishment from Paradise because they disobeyed God by eating from the tree which He had forbidden. The Church reminds us of this event, to encourage us to return to that ancient glory and primeval happiness, by means of fasting and obedience to God and His commandments.

By Your indescribable compassion, O Christ our God, make us worthy of the Paradise of delight and have mercy on us, for You alone are the Lover of mankind. Amen.
