

The PC will continue to evaluate the SJH accessibility project over the summer and will continue the discussion when meetings resume in September.


The cupolas will be finished in the next couple weeks and have been moved from the Johnson's garage to the school. Research will be done to decide on the best method of installing the cupolas.

THE SYNAXARION

Pentecost



On this day - the fiftieth day after Great and Holy Pascha - we celebrate Holy Pentecost: the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the holy Disciples and Apostles in the form of tongues of fire.

Verses

In a violent wind Christ distributes the Divine Spirit; In the form of fiery tongues unto the Apostles; In one great day, the Spirit was poured forth upon the Fishermen.

Numbering about 120, the followers of the Master gathered in Jerusalem in the upper room of a house to await the Lord's promise to send the Holy Spirit. At about the third hour of the day, or 9:00 in the morning, there came a sound from Heaven as that of a mighty rushing

wind and it filled the house. Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak, not with the languages of their ancestors, but with another language, as the Holy Spirit inspired them and gave them utterance. When the sound of the rushing wind occurred, a large crowd of people gathered around and became very confused and amazed, because everyone heard the disciples speak in his own language. The Apostle Peter raised his voice and declared what had happened and preached the Resurrection of Christ and 3,000 people joined the Church on this, the day of its birth. Three important things take place on the Feast of Pentecost: the coming of the Holy Spirit into the world, the fulfillment of the promise of Jesus Christ, and the completion of the undefiled hope of the Apostles.

By the intercessions of the Holy Apostles, O Christ our God, have mercy on us. Amen.
