





### Orthodoxy Sunday – 1st Lent

On March 24, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate Venerable Father Zachariah the recluse and Artemon, bishop of Seleucia; and New-hieromartyr Parthenios, patriarch of Constantinople.



On this same day, the First Sunday of the Fast, we make remembrance of the restoration of the holy and venerable Icons, which took place through the ever-memorable Rulers of Constantinople, Michael and his mother, Theodora, during the patriarchate of Saint Methodios the Confessor.

#### Verses

The icons were formerly and unfittingly banished.

I rejoice, as I see them properly reverenced.

This restoration was accomplished in the year 842. Theodora's husband was vehemently against icons. After his

death, Theodora venerated an icon of the Theotokos in front of Patriarch Methodios. The other faithful in the church did the same, venerating all the icons, considering them to be representations of their original elements, not idols. Theodora prayed to God to forgive her husband during the first week of Great Lent; and on the First Sunday of the Fast, she led the way in hanging up the icons to adorn the churches.

O eternal and unchanging Icon of the Father, Christ our God, through the intercessions of Your holy Confessors, have mercy on us. Amen.
