



# Feast Days and Services

### Services for Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple

Thursday, November 20
Baptism at 5:45pm
Vesperal Divine Liturgy at 6:15pm



This feast day, November 21, commemorates when the Theotokos was brought as a small child into the temple in Jerusalem by her parents, Joachim and Anna. She was received by Zachariah, the father of John the Baptist.



### The Advent Fast – November 15 Through December 24

The Advent Fast began November 15. (Due to the American holiday of Thanksgiving, some begin this fast in earnest on December 1 or else they take a four-day break from the fast from Thanksgiving through the following Sunday.) It is usual to limit both the number of meals and the amount of food eaten. The Church's complete Rule calls for abstinence from all meat and animal products. However, fish, wine and oil may be eaten on all days except Wednesdays and Fridays, up to December 20, which is the beginning of the Forefeast, the "Holy Week" before Christmas. After December 20 the fast should become more



rigorous. The strict fast of Christmas Eve in broken by a fasting meal after the evening Liturgy. (Note: When Christmas Eve falls on a Saturday or Sunday it is not a strict fast day but is kept as any regular fasting day in Advent). There is no fasting on Christmas Day up to the Eve of Epiphany.





### **Matthew the Evangelist – November 16**



On November 16, in the Holy Orthodox Church we commemorate the holy Apostle and Evangelist Matthew.

#### Verses

Matthew cried from the midst of the fire: My Jesus! I give thanks to You, for You even save publicans.

On the sixteenth, the raging fire slew Matthew.

He was the son of Alphaeus, and was a tax collector, also known as a publican, when the Lord saw him in Capernaum and said to him: "Follow Me,' and he arose, and followed Him." After that, Matthew received the Lord in his home where He expressed several great truths about His coming to earth. After receiving the Holy Spirit, Matthew

preached the Gospel to the Parthians, Medes and Ethiopians. Matthew baptized the prince of Ethiopia's wife and son, at which the prince became greatly enraged. He dispatched soldiers to bring Matthew to trial. However, Matthew's face shined so brightly that they could not look at him. When the prince approached him, Matthew radiated such light that the prince was instantly blinded. However, the holy apostle had a compassionate heart and he prayed to God, and the prince's sight was restored. Even so, the prince arrested Matthew and subjected him to cruel tortures and then burned him in fire. Ironically, after Matthew's death, the prince repented and was baptized. The prince took the name "Matthew", gave up his princely wealth and ultimately served as a priest.

On this day, we also commemorate the Martyr Ephygenia of Ethiopia, disciple of St. Matthew; and Fulvian, prince of Ethiopia.

By their intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
