The Trisagion Prayers

The Six Psalms

Psalm 3

Lord, how they have increased who trouble me! Many are they who rise up against me. Many are they who say of me, "There is no help for him in God." But You, O Lord, are a shield for me, my glory and the One Who lifts up my head. I cried to the Lord with my voice, and He heard me from His holy hill. I lay down and slept; I awoke, for the Lord sustained me. I will not be afraid of ten thousands of people who have set themselves against me all around. Arise, O Lord; save me, O my God! My wounds are foul and festering because of my foolishness. I am troubled, I am bowed down greatly; I go mourning all the day long. For my loins are full of inflammation, and there is no soundness in my flesh. I am feeble

and severely broken; I groan because of the turmoil of my heart. Lord, all my desire is before You; and my sighing is not hidden from You. My heart pants, my strength fails me; as for the light of my eyes, it also has gone from me. My loved ones and my friends stand aloof from my plague, and my relatives stand afar off. Psalm 88 (LXX 87)

O Lord, God of my salvation, I have cried out day and night before You. Let my prayer come before You; incline Your ear to my cry. For my soul is full of troubles, and my life draws near to the grave. I am counted with those who go down to the

pit; I am like a man who has no strength, adrift among the dead, like the slain who lie in the grave, whom You remember no more, and who are cut off from Your hand. You have laid me in the lowest pit, in darkness, in the depths. Your wrath lies heavy upon me, and You have afflicted me with all your waves. You have put away my acquaintances far from me; You have made me an abomination to them; I am shut up, and I cannot get out; my eye wastes away because of affliction. Lord, I have called daily upon You; I have stretched out my hands to You. Will You work wonders for the dead? Shall the dead arise and praise You? Shall Your lovingkindness be declared in the grave? The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in mercy. He will not always strive with us, nor will He keep His anger forever. The Gospel Reading - Matthew 1:18-25

Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." So all this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying: "Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us." Then Joseph, being aroused from sleep, did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took to him his wife, and did not know her till she had brought forth her firstborn Son. And he called His name Jesus.

Psalm 51 (LXX 50)

Do not cast me away from Your presence, and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation, and uphold me by Your generous Spirit. Then I will teach transgressors Your ways, and sinners shall be converted to You. Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, the God of my salvation, and my tongue shall sing aloud of Your righteousness. O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth shall show forth Your praise. For You do not desire sacrifice, or else I would give it; You do not delight in burnt offering. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit, a broken and a contrite heart — these, O God, You will not despise. Do good in Your good pleasure to Zion; build the walls of Jerusalem. Then You shall be pleased with the sacrifices of righteousness, with burnt offering and whole burnt offering; then they shall offer bulls on Your altar.

On December 25, in the Holy Orthodox Church we celebrate the Nativity according to the flesh of our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ.

The little Child born is God, and the Mother, a Virgin;


What greater marvel has ever appeared in creation? On the twenty-fifth, Mary the Virgin gave birth to God.

On this day we commemorate the Shepherds that behold the Lord: Shepherds come and abandon their own flock, and hasten to see Christ the Good Shepherd.

Thus entered into the world He, Whose coming was foretold by the prophets, and Who was born in the same manner in which it had been prophesied: of a most-holy Virgin, in the town of Bethlehem, of the lineage of David according to the flesh, at the time when there was no king in Jerusalem of the lineage of Judah, but rather a foreigner named Herod was reigning. This Herod, who sought to kill the infant Messiah. After many types and prefigurings, messengers and heralds, prophets and righteous men, wise men and kings, finally He appeared, the Lord of the world and King of kings, to perform the work of the salvation of mankind. 






Ode 5 - 2nd Canon

Refrain: Glory to You our God, glory to You.






Ode 6 - 2nd Canon


Refrain: Glory to You our God, glory to You.

Ode 9 - 1st Canon

Irmos: A mystery I behold which is strange and wondrous. The cave is heaven and the Virgin is the throne of the cherubim. In the confines of a manger is laid the infinite Christ our God, Whom we praise and magnify.

<u>Refrain</u> O my soul magnify God born in the flesh from the Virgin.

The Magi, beholding the strange course of an unknown and newly shining star that exceeded the brightness of all heavenly light, learned from it that Christ the King was born on earth in Bethlehem for our salvation.

<u>Refrain</u> O my soul magnify the King born in a cave.

"Where is the new-born Child and King, Whose star we have seen?" said the Magi, "for we have come to worship Him." Herod, the enemy of God, was troubled, and in his wild madness he plotted how to kill Christ.

<u>Refrain</u> O my soul magnify the pure Virgin who has given birth to Christ the King.

Herod inquired as to what time the guiding star appeared, which brought the Magi to Bethlehem to worship Christ with gifts. Led back to their own land by that same star, they returned not to Herod, but mocked the wicked slayer of children.







And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. 


