

- The PC members shared highlights of their summer and reflected on the contributions and loss of Bruce Johnson. They also welcomed the new PC member. Derick Hanna.
- The PC will start the process of finding a new co-chair from amongst the PC members.
- It was recognized that more liturgy books are needed and so more will be made available. The PC also discussed the importance and process of welcoming new members and are brainstorming the best way to ensure that all feel welcomed and incorporated into the Parish. Welcome packets are being created with a plan to have them available for visitors.
- With the Preschool class moving out of one of the SJH basement apartments, it's now available, and two young women who are both catechumens in the Church will be staying there.
- The Maranatha House renovations are complete.
- Fr. Marc provided an update on the Parish's summer activities. In summary, Bishop John's visit went well. The ERI was well attended. The ERI recordings are available now at eagleriverinstitute.org
- The PC continued the discussion on the proposed endowment fund.
- The PC also continued the discussion of the renovation project to make the SJH handicap accessible. None of the plans we considered so far seem to fit as well as we would like. More planning is needed and will be in the works over the next several months.



THE SYNAXARION

Joel the Prophet – October 19



On October 19, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the holy and glorious Prophet Joel.

Verses

Joel, who in tragic strains sang the earth's sufferings, Has passed from the earth to a place above sufferings. On the nineteenth, death concealed the Prophet Joel.

Joel was the son of Phanuel of the tribe of Reuben. He lived 800 years before Christ and foretold the misfortunes of the Israelites and their captivity in Babylon for the sins that they had committed against God. He called the people to fasting and the priests to penitent and tearful prayer that God would have mercy on them; and they listened to him. Joel also

prophesied of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, and the outpouring of His grace on all the faithful. He foretold and described the Dreadful Judgment of God, and the glory of God's holy Church.

On this day, we also commemorate the Martyr Varos and seven martyrs with him; the Righteous Mother Cleopatra of Palestine; the Venerable John of Rila; Prochoros of Pchinja and Archpriest John of Kronstadt, the wonderworker. By the intercessions of Your saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
