



Thank you St John's Parish! Our donation helps the People Suffering in the War!

The St. Michael's Church of the Ukrainian Poltava Diocese of the Orthodox Church of Ukraine is in the city of Poltava.

The church was recently built with donations from parishioners. The church was built on the site of the one destroyed by the Soviet authorities. A Sunday school for children operates at the church, and a volunteer center has been organized. With the blessing of the ruling hierarch, Bishop Afnasy, since April 2014, the rector of the church, Archpriest Oleksandr Gorai, has been appointed head of the diocesan volunteer center. Since then, a large number of volunteer trips to the front have been made, tons of humanitarian aid have been delivered, more than 20 engines for armored personnel carriers have been repaired, several dozen armored personnel carriers have been sheathed with anti-cumulative protection, more than 20 cars have been brought and transferred to the Armed Forces of Ukraine, dozens of nets have been woven, thousands of pillows have been sewn, thousands of trench candles have been cast, and thousands of cans of homemade slushies have been preserved. The center has sisters of mercy who visit the wounded in hospitals, candlemakers pour trench candles, a pie battalion bakes pastries, a pillow platoon does sewing. Everyone helps as they can. Thank you all!

Dear Fr. Marc and Saint John Church!

On behalf of our international volunteer team, I wish to extend my wholehearted thanks for your cooperation and kindness in assisting the fundraising efforts in support of the heroic Ukrainian defenders engaged in the fight to defend their country. I would like to express gratitude to each of you who has constantly made and continue to make a personal contribution to this project. Each dollar is value and important.

Ukrainian people are waging a desperate battle for the survival of their country. Just yesterday many of them were ordinary people: teachers, engineers, doctors, and artists. Some were college students or farmers or factory workers. In the past year, their lives have been completely upended. They are soldiers in a war they never wanted, that was forced upon Ukraine by aggressive neighbor Russia.

In 2014 Russia launched an undeclared war in eastern Ukraine, in their efforts of colonization as they occupied East part of Ukraine including Crimea's peninsula in their desire to restore completely the Soviet Union and spread their protectorate on East part of Europe Union.

Ukrainians, however, have been a free-spirited people and have striven towards a high level of socio-economic development while heroically resisting Russian aggression. This war has brought about the destruction of hundreds of villages and cities and incurred the deaths of hundreds of thousands of civilians and soldiers alike. Some ten million war refugees have left their homeland thus disfiguring their very fate. Every day brings new irreparable losses, grief, and pain. This war is very familiar to me because my family is in the same desperate situation as all other Ukrainian families. Now they live practically without possibility to use electricity and heating system due to constant intentional bombing and shelling critical infrastructure. The temperature in residential premises is only 1-5 degrees of Celsius. However, despite the hardships of war and the grief of irreplaceable human losses, Ukrainians do not give up and do not lose their strength of spirit and faith in victory. And in this resilience has also part our collective contribution and support.

On behalf of Fr. Alexander and St. Michael's Parish of the Orthodox Church of Ukraine city Poltava, allow me to express our deep gratitude and appreciation for the help and support with fundraising given to the Ukrainian defenders.

With your kind support together, we were able to raise funds to purchase a car for brigade of defenders in the Pokrovsk direction. Pokrovsk is city was born legendary Christmas Ukrainian song that everybody around the world knows as "Carol of the Bells". Today Porovsk is the hottest point of a frontline of war or, as saying our volunteers "the hellish cauldron of this war. Our help is without exaggeration, vital and help to save lives of people, evacuate injured and helps civilians. On this Friday o. Oleksander left for Poland to pick up this car and transport it to Pokrovsk.

As well I would like to share information about o. Oleksander and St. Michael's Parish of the Orthodox Church (c.Poltava, Ukraine).

THE SYNAXARION

Prodigal Son – 2nd PreLent – February 8



On February 8, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Great-martyr Theodore the General ('Stratelates'); the Prophet Zachariah; and Sabbas the Second, archbishop of Serbia.

On the Sunday which falls during the Post-feast of the Meeting of our Lord, we commemorate the Holy and Righteous Mothers of the Three Hierarchs: Emmelia, the mother of St. Basil the Great, Anthousa, mother of Saint John Chrysostom and Nonna, mother of Saint Gregory the Theologian.

On this day, we remember the Parable of the Prodigal Son, which occurs in the Gospel and which our deified Fathers brought further honor in the Lenten Triodion.

Verses

*O you who are like me, a prodigal,
come forward with confidence and tranquility;
For unto all has been opened the door of divine
mercy.*

In the parable given to us by our Savior, Jesus illustrates three things: the condition of the sinner, the canon of repentance and the knowledge of God's compassion. For in the person of the prodigal son, we view the wretched condition that sin creates for us: that we are distant from God and His Sacraments. However, when we become aware of ourselves and awaken, we hasten with hope and return to Him through repentance. Our Savior calls back to His mansions all those who have been overtaken by despair, lacking the hope of forgiveness for their grave sins. The Father encourages all his lost children to remove the desperation from their hearts and revive their energies for virtuous deeds.

Through Your inexpressible love for mankind, O Christ our God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
