



No Vespers on Friday**



Please remember to fill out or update your list of departed family members, Orthodox and non-Orthodox. Your previous forms will be in your mail-box folder in the Narthex and new forms will be available on the table. (*They will be available Friday and Saturday morning.*) Please place your completed forms in the basket provided and have this done before Divine Liturgy this Saturday morning.

For those new to our Church, I want to say something about the service on Saturday morning and encourage you to come to this, if you can. It is the Orthodox custom to have a special service each year on the Saturday of this week to remember our departed loved ones. This Saturday precedes the Sunday in which we remember the Last Judgment at the end of the world. We are compelled to pray for our departed because we love them. We commend them in our prayers to God, Who is beyond time and is merciful and loves all humankind. The service on Saturday morning begins at 9:15am. In the Narthex (entry) there will be slips of paper on which you can write the first names of your departed loved ones from your family. This is not meant to be a list of all your ancestors, but simply those whom you know and carry in your heart. We will read all these names aloud at the end of Liturgy. Also, we will share Koliva (a sweetened boiled wheat) at the end of Liturgy. This makes us think of the words of our Lord in John 12:24, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it produces much grain." —Fr. ### **“Meatfare Week” – A Warm-up to Fasting**

#### **February 16 – February 22**

In many ways the Church invites us to think ahead and be intentional about our spiritual journey through the season of Lent. One of these is this coming week before the fast of Lent begins. During this week the Church asks us to fast from meat only as a kind of warm-up to the full fasting that begins on “Clean Monday.” **Fish, wine, oil and dairy are allowed everyday of this week.** For some fasting from meat is the extent of their Lenten fasting and that even this in our culture today is quite a remarkable effort. Still, I encourage everyone to be mindful in some way of this “Meatfare Week” and to use it to prepare your family for the effort of Lent.



### THE SYNAXARION

#### Last Judgment – 3<sup>rd</sup> PreLent

On February 15, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Apostle Onesimos of the Seventy; Venerable Eusebios of Syria; the Martyr Major of Gaza; and Venerable Dalmatos of Siberia.



It is the Sunday of the Last Judgment – also known as Meat Fare Sunday – which is the lesson that we read in today's Holy Gospel. Jesus illustrates to us God's indescribable goodness and His great love for mankind. And so, lest some who are lazy, loiter and spend their time in the pursuit of sin, rather than spending their time appropriately to their salvation, and then be suddenly overtaken by death, the divine Fathers decided that on this day the remembrance of the Second Appearance of Christ is to be celebrated. The intention is to remind us all, that God is good and loves mankind, but He is also a very righteous Judge Who rewards each of us according to our deeds. Our Lord teaches us that when we minister to our brother or sister, we really minister to Him. This brings us righteousness and life eternal.
