

## Our Parish Council is Re-establishing a Cemetery Committee

We now have 50 people buried in our Cathedral cemetery. This is a great blessing for a parish to have its own cemetery, but also it is also a great responsibility. We need a committee to help care for our cemetery, and we are looking for at least 5 people (up to 7) to serve on this committee. Duties of the committee will include:

- Update existing cemetery guidelines, including guidelines for who may be buried in the cemetery
- Establish bylaws and duties of Cemetery Committee
- Assist families in ordering monuments and crosses
- Bring existing monuments up to standards
- Help plan improvements to our current space and proposals for future expansion

A term on the committee is 3 years. The committee will normally meet twice a year, but some extra meetings will be needed at the beginning to get things sorted out. 

# Great news! Our St. Sergius Chapel will Soon Have Two New Beautiful Cupolas

At this time, scaffolding is being erected for the installation, which should take place in the next two weeks. This is a true parish project and a reflection of our community, as the cupolas were designed and fabricated by parishioners, Sam Stogstill and Myles Kelly, with gold leafing help by Kathy Stone and welding help by Jana Jenkins. Our facilities manager, John Marc Dunaway, cleared the way by removing the old cupolas and has coordinated installation efforts with a local contractor, Kuchar Construction, whose children graduated from Saint John's School last year. The St. Sergius Chapel is a cherished part of the St. John community, and the new cupolas will be beacons to the faithful for years to come.

A conference was held at Beach Lake Cabin on Sep 26, 27 to encourage dialogue between Orthodox and Evangelical leaders. Fr. Marc presented an overview of how one becomes an Orthodox Christian, from enrollment as a catechumen

through the sacraments of Baptism and Chrismation. Joel Stamoolis from Wasilla Bible Church responded with an explanation of the



Baptism service at his church. About 25 people attended, including Mark Oxbrow from England, representing the Lausanne Orthodox Initiative. The other major topic was the Council of Nicaea and its Creed as a unifying statement of faith. This was the first conference in what is hoped to be an annual series in memory of Fr. Michael Oleksa.

### **Innocent, Apostle to America – October 6**

On October 6, in the Holy Orthodox Church we commemorate Innocent, Metropolitan of Moscow, Enlightener of the Aleuts and Apostle to America, named in the world: John Popov-Veniaminov.

John was born in 1797 in Irkutsk into the family of a sacristan. The boy mastered his studies at an early age and by age seven he was reading the Epistle in church. In 1806 they sent him to the Irkutsk seminary. The missionary service of the future Apostle of America and Siberia began in 1823. Father John spent 45 years laboring for the enlightenment of the peoples of Kamchatka, the Aleutian Islands, North America, Yakutsk, the Khabarov frontier, performing his apostolic calling in severe conditions and at great risks to life. Father

John baptized ten thousand people, built churches, taught the fundamentals of the Christian life and translated the holy services into the native tongues of the various lands he served. In 1840, after the death of his wife, Father John was tonsured a monk with the name Innocent by St. Philaret, the Metropolitan of Moscow, in honor of St. Innocent of Irkutsk. Innocent was consecrated Bishop of Kamchatka, the Kurile and Aleutian Islands. In 1868, Innocent succeeded Metropolitan Philaret on the Moscow cathedra. He fell asleep in the Lord in 1879, on Holy Saturday, and on October 6, 1977, Archimandrite Innocent was glorified as a Saint by the Russian Orthodox Church.

#### **Charitina of Amisos – October 5**

On October 5, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Martyr Charitina of Amisos.

#### Verses

That for which she prayed, the loosing of the body, behold Charitina receives by praying.

On the fifth Charitina entered the city of God.

Orphaned young, Charitina was adopted by an eminent Christian man called Claudius, who brought her up as his own daughter. Charitina studied the law of God day and night and vowed to live in perpetual virginity as a true bride of Christ. The governor Dometius wanted to kill Charitina because she led many to the Lord. A



judge ordered that her hair be cut off, and live coals put on her head, but the maiden was preserved by God's power. She was bound to a wheel which began to turn, but an angel of God stopped the wheel and Charitina remained unharmed. Then the wicked judge sent some depraved youths to take her virginity. Fearing this attack, Charitina knelt in prayer to God to receive her soul before

that could happen. At that moment, her soul soared to the immortal Kingdom of Christ in the year 290.

On this day, we also commemorate Venerable John, bishop of Euchaïta; Venerable Eudokimos of Vatopedi monastery on Athos; and the uncovering of the relics of our fathers among the saints Peter, Alexis, Jonah, Philip and Hermogenes, metropolitans of Moscow. By their intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen
