## Send a Christmas Gift to UKRAINE Today

**Christmas in Ukraine is Celebrated on January 7, Old Calendar.**

Saint John's will send a monetary Christmas gift this week to Fr. Oleksander in Ukraine, an Orthodox priest Oksana Artz knows. We have helped previously with medical supplies and with the purchase of a van to transport wounded people. This tragic war against the Ukrainian people continues to destroy homes and devastate families. If you want to add to this donation, it will be a Christmas gift from Alaska to Ukraine from all of us. You can contribute by donating to Saint John's and marking it "Ukraine." Below is a letter from Oksana Artz, a member of our Parish, explaining more. – Fr. Marc

**Dear Fr. Marc and Saint John Church!**

I appeal to you on behalf of our international volunteer team to help with the organization of fundraising in our church. All raised funds will be sent directly to Ukrainian defenders through Fr. Alexander Horay (Orthodox Church in c. Poltava, Ukraine).

Ukrainians are waging a desperate battle for the survival of their country. Just yesterday many of them were ordinary people: teachers, engineers, doctors, and artists. Some were college students or farmers or factory workers. In the past year, their lives have been completely upended. They are soldiers in a war they never wanted, that was forced upon their land.



In 2014 Russia launched an undeclared war in eastern Ukraine, in their efforts of colonization as they occupied the East part of Ukraine including Crimea's peninsula in their desire to completely restore the Soviet Union and spread their protectorate on the East part of Europe Union.

Ukrainians, however, have been a free-spirited people and have striven towards a high level of socio-economic development while heroically resisting Russian aggression. This war has brought about the destruction of hundreds of villages and cities and incurred the deaths of hundreds of thousands of civilians and soldiers alike. Some six million war refugees have left their homeland thus disfiguring their very fate. Every day brings new irreparable losses, grief, and pain. This war is very familiar to me because my family is in the same desperate situation as all other Ukrainian families. Only together our voices will be significant and powerful, only together we can prevent the genocide, that's going on right now, and save human lives. There are no alien war and someone else's grief in this world. We are all responsible for peace on our land. I will be very appreciative and grateful for any possible help. Each dollar now is valuable, because every dollar raised is a life saved.


## THE SYNAXARION

### Theodosius the Cenobiarch – January 11

On January 11, in the Holy Orthodox Church we continue to celebrate the Epiphany of our Lord Jesus Christ, and we commemorate our righteous Father Theodosius the Cenobiarch, the instructor of the wilderness.

#### *Verses*

*Theodosius was the leader of many monks' common life.  
And his departure from this life was many monks' common loss.  
On the eleventh the Cenobiarch left this ruinous life.*



Theodosius the Great lived in Palestine and was the founder and organizer of the cenobitic style of monasticism, in which the monks would spend more time together in organized monastic groups in common prayer on a regular basis. As a young man he visited Simeon the Stylite, who blessed him and predicted for him great spiritual glory. Once Theodosius founded his monastery, many monks of different nationalities and languages quickly gathered around him. He built churches for each language group, but on a day when they were to receive Communion, all the brethren gathered in the great church. Together with Saint Sabbas, he defended Palestine from the heresy of the Monophysites. God endowed Theodosius with the gifts of wonderworking, to heal the sick, to be present and help from a distance, to tame wild beasts, among other gifts. Theodosius entered peacefully into rest in the Lord in the year 529, at the age of 105.

On this day, we also commemorate the Venerable Theodosius of a monastery on Athos; Venerable Agapios of Syria; and Venerable Michael of Klops, fool-for-Christ.

By their intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
