

Sydney Ihde worked on crafts, sorted clothing, prepared, and served food, did dishes, cleaned, and took a tour of the center together.

This agency is incredible and offers so much to the community. They currently house around 70 women (and never turn women away who need a place to sleep), serves three meals a day (including a daily meal outside to men), have a shower house, a culinary and bakery program to train men and women, a food truck to employee teens, a housing complex nearby to house those going through their programs. Over 400+ people list them as their place of residence for PFD's, jobs, housing, and mail, etc.! They do so much for those in our community and rely a lot on volunteer help.

Martha Fisher organized a day for our children to make cards to bring to the Hope center. We gave each one a card with their lunch bags and many of them smiled looking at their cute drawings (3) Thank you so much for the group that came to the Center, it went so smoothly and was a great way to spend a Friday morning.

## Mary of Egypt – 5<sup>th</sup> Lent

On April 21, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Hieromartyr Januarios, bishop of Benevento, and his companions, and the Martyr Alexandra the Queen and her companions.



On this day, the Fifth Sunday of Great Lent, we make remembrance of our Godly Mother Mary of Egypt.

#### Verses

The spirit rose up and the flesh melted away. Hide, O earth, the worn relics of Mary's body.

Once, during the fast of Great Lent, the priest-monk Zosimus withdrew into the wilderness beyond the Jordan. Suddenly, he caught sight of a human being with a withered and naked body whose hair was as white as snow. Zosimus tossed his outer garment to her which she wrapped around herself and then showed herself to him. Mary then told Zosimus that she was born in Egypt and at the age of 12 began to live a life of debauchery in

Alexandria for 17 years. One day, she went to Jerusalem to enter the church to venerate the Honorable Cross. However, some invisible force restrained her and prevented her from entering. In great fear, she gazed upon the icon of the Theotokos in the vestibule and prayed that she be allowed to enter the church, all the while confessing her sinfulness and uncleanness. She was then permitted to enter the church. Having venerated the Cross, she again entered the vestibule and, before the icon, gave thanks to the Mother of God. At that very moment she heard a voice saying: "If you cross the Jordan, you will find glorious rest!" Mary left for the wilderness and remained there for 47 years in repentance. When she encountered Zosimus, Mary told him of her life story. She asked him to come back in one year with Holy Communion, which he did. The following year, on Holy Thursday, April 1, 522, Zosimus discovered Mary's lifeless body, and buried her. Thus, the Lord glorifies penitent sinners. The Church exalts and exemplifies Mary to the faithful in Great Lent as an incentive for repentance which brings entry into the Heavenly Kingdom.

Through her intercessions, O God, have mercy upon us and save us. Amen.
