#### Psalm 3



# Matins Gospel Reading: Eothinon 9 - John 20:19-31

Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace be with you." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." Now Thomas, called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. The other disciples therefore said to him, "We have seen the Lord." So he said to them, "Unless I see in His hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe." And after eight days His disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus came, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, "Peace to you!" Then He said to Thomas, "Reach your finger here, and look at My hands; and reach your hand here, and put it into My side. Do not be unbelieving, but believing." And Thomas answered and said to Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Thomas, because you have seen Me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which

are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.

We all hope to be saved by You for you are the helper and support of us all.

# Synaxarion of the Day

On October 26, in the Holy Orthodox Church we commemorate the holy, glorious, and right-victorious Great-Martyr Demetrius, the Wonderworker and Myrrh-Streaming.

#### Verses

O Christ my Savior, spears have pierced Demetrius, Who emulated Your pierced side in Your Passion. On the twenty-sixth spears did away Demetrius.

His father was the military commander of Salonica, and, when he died, the Emperor Maximian made Demetrius commander in his place. In doing this, the Emperor, an opponent of Christ, particularly recommended him to persecute and exterminate the Christians in Salonica. Demetrius not only disobeyed the Emperor, but he openly confessed and preached Christ the Lord in the city. The enraged Emperor cast him into prison. Knowing what awaited him, Demetrius gave his goods to his faithful servant, Lupus, to give to the poor, and went off to prison, rejoicing that suffering for Christ was to be his lot. After several days, the Emperor sent soldiers to the prison to kill Demetrius. They came upon the saint at prayer, and ran him through with their spears. Christians secretly took his body and gave it burial, and there flowed from it myrrh by which many of the sick were healed. Demetrius entered the heavenly mansions in the year 306.

On this day, we also remember the great and terrible earthquake in Constantinople in 740. This was a terrifying and long-lasting disaster in the time of Leo the Isaurian, the first of the iconoclast emperors. The people realized that this was God's punishment for their sins, and entreated the most holy Mother of God and St. Demetrius with great penitence, until God had mercy and ended the earthquake.

On this day, we also commemorate the Venerable-martyr Joasaph of Dionysiou monastery on Athos. By the intercessions of Your Saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.

#### Canon - Akathist Theotokos: Tone 4

#### Katavasia Odes 1-8

Ode 1: I shall open my mouth and the Spirit will inspire it, and I shall utter the words of my song to the Queen and Mother: I shall be seen radiantly keeping feast and joyfully praising her wonders.

**Ode 3:** O Mother of God, living and plentiful fount, give strength to those united in spiritual fellowship, who sing hymns of praise to you; and in your divine glory grant to them crowns of glory.

**Ode 4:** He Who sits in glory upon the throne of the Godhead, Jesus the true God, has come in a swift cloud, and with His pure and mighty hand He has saved those who cry: Glory to Your power, O Lord.

Ode 5: The whole world was amazed at your divine glory, for you, O Virgin who have not known wedlock, have held in your womb the God of all, and have given birth to an eternal Son, Who rewards with salvation all who sing your praises.

**Ode 6:** As we, celebrate this sacred and solemn feast of the Mother of God, let us come, clapping our hands, O people of the Lord, and give glory to God Who was borne of her.

**Ode 7:** The holy Children bravely trampled upon the threatening fire, refusing to worship created things in place of the Creator, and they sang in joy: "Blessed are You and praised above all, O God of our Fathers."

We praise, bless and worship the Lord, singing and exalting Him above all forever.

**Ode 8:** The Offspring of the Theotokos saved the holy Children in the furnace. He Who was then prefigured has since been born on earth, and He gathers together all creation to sing: "O all you works of the Lord, bless the Lord and exalt Him above all forever."

#### Matins Canon – 9th Ode:

DEACON: The Theotokos and Mother of the Light, let us honor and magnify in song.

"My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.

*Refrain:* More hon'rable than the cherubim and more glorious beyond compare than the seraphim, who without corruption gave birth to God the Word and are truly Theotokos, we magnify you.

For He has regarded the lowliness of His handmaiden, for behold from this time forth all generations shall call me blessed. For He Who is mighty has magnified me, and holy is His name, and His mercy is on those who fear Him throughout all generations.

He has shown strength with His arm. He has scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He has put down the mighty from their seat, and has exalted the humble and meek.

He has filled the empty with good things and the rich He has sent away empty. Remembering His mercy He has helped His servant Israel as He promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed forever."

If needed, the cantor sings the 9<sup>th</sup> Ode Resurrection verses for the Tone of the Week while the deacon completes censing altar, then concludes with the 9<sup>th</sup> Ode Katavasia of the Feast or Season.

Ode 9: Let every mortal born on earth, radiant with light, in spirit leap for joy; and let the hosts of the angelic powers celebrate and honor the holy feast of the Mother of God, and let them cry: Rejoice! Pure and blessed ever-Virgin, who gave birth to God.






The righteous man shall flourish like a palm tree, and like a cedar in Lebanon shall he be multiplied.



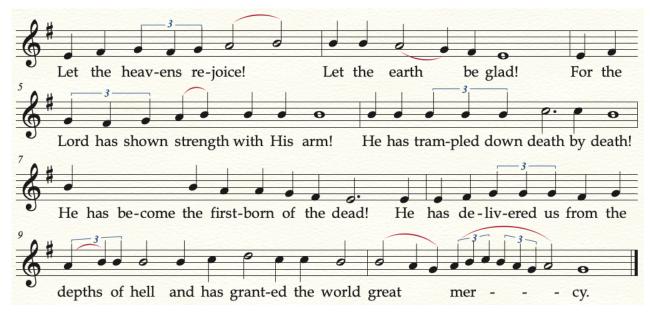

They also who had seen it told them by what means he who had been demon-possessed was healed. Then the whole multitude of the surrounding region of the Gadarenes asked Him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. And He got into the boat and returned. Now the man from whom the demons had departed begged Him that he might be with Him. But Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your own house, and tell what great things God has done for you." And he went his way and proclaimed throughout the whole city what great things Jesus had done for him.

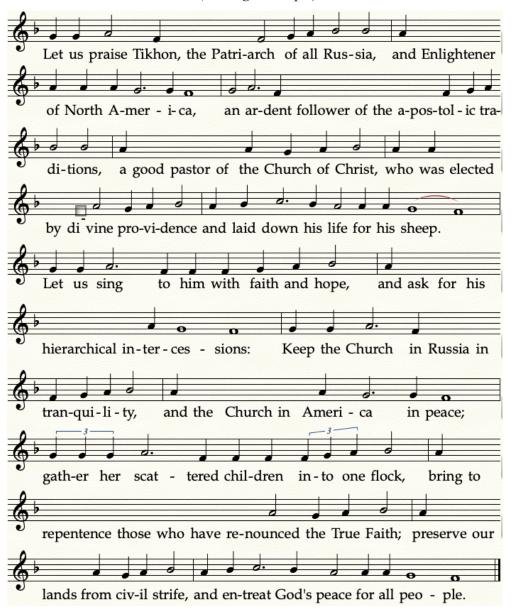
