

The Meeting of the Lord in the Temple (also called the Presentation) is one of the Great Feasts of the Orthodox Church, celebrated on Feb 2.

In the Gospel of Luke 2:22-40, Mary and Joseph took the infant Christ to the Temple in Jerusalem. He was received in the arms of the elder Simeon, who then prayed, "Now let Thy servant depart in peace... for I have seen Thy salvation." This was one of the things that Mary "pondered in her heart"—the fact that others recognized that her Son was the Messiah.

## Ladies Tea – Saturday, January 24 10am to Noon



## 1/13/26 Parish Council Meeting Summary

- The PC members all shared about someone that is influential in their lives.
- The PC discussed the current PC members term lengths. Laurie S will extend for an additional year to allow two members per year to rotate off the PC.
- The PC discussed coffee hour. The results of our discussion were shared with the parish via letter the Sunday after our meeting.
- The PC reviewed and accepted the endowment bylaws. There will be a soft launch for the endowment at the March church family meeting
- We discussed the importance and process of new parish members getting sponsors.
- The Western Alaska Fundraiser was mentioned. Please see the Good Works Basket announcements in the bulletin for parish fundraising efforts.
- The PC discussed the charity budget. It was decided by the PC that all recurring charity contributions will be reviewed yearly to ensure that they align with the church mission. Additionally, no more than half of the charity budget will be reserved for recurring charitable contributions. The other half will be held for the emergency requests that come up regularly. We will discuss 2026 charitable contributions after finalizing the budget at our next meeting.
- The next church family meeting has been scheduled for March 21<sup>st</sup>
- The PC voted to approve the cemetery committee bylaws.
- Planning work continues for the SJH accessibility project.
- Plans to host coffee mornings at the SJH were discussed.
- The PC discussed the noise level in the church basement during coffee hour. A PC member was assigned to research possible solutions to this problem.







## THE SYNAXARION



### Gregory the Theologian – January 25

On January 25, in the Holy Orthodox Church we commemorate our Father among the Saints Gregory the Theologian, Archbishop of Constantinople.

#### *Verses*

*To acknowledge God's essence in Orthodox manner:*

*Such is this Gregory's legacy unto Christians.*

*On the twenty-fifth Gregory of divine speech died.*

He was born in Nazianzus and studied in Athens with Basil the Great and Julian the Apostate. Gregory correctly prophesied that Julian would become an apostate, a renouncer and a persecutor of the Church. When he completed his studies, Gregory was baptized. Basil consecrated him as bishop of Sasima, and Emperor Theodosius the Great summoned him to fill the vacant arch-episcopal throne of Constantinople. Gregory wrote numerous works, of which his most famous are those concerning theology. Especially known because of its depth is his work Homilies on the Holy Trinity. Gregory wrote against the heretic Macedonius who erroneously taught that the Holy Spirit is a creation of God, and against Appolinarius who erroneously taught that Christ did not have a human soul but that His divinity took the place of His soul. Gregory died in 390 at age 80.

On this day, we also commemorate Venerable Demetrios the Sacristan; and New-martyr Auxentios of Constantinople.

By their intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
