



## The Falling-Asleep of St. John the Evangelist Feast Day – September 26

We will transfer some aspects of this Feast to Sunday, September 28.

John was the son of Zebedee the fisherman and Salome the daughter of Joseph, the betrothed of the Holy Theotokos. Called by the Lord Jesus, John immediately left his father and his fishermen's nets and, with his brother James, followed Christ. From then on, he was not separated from his Lord until the end.



He was over one hundred years old when he went to the Lord. When his disciples later opened his grave, they did not find his body. On May 8 of every year, a fine dust, fragrant and healing, rose from his grave. After a long, laborious and

fruitful life on earth, this beloved disciple of Christ, a true pillar of the Church, took up his habitation in the joy of His Lord.

He was called Theologian because he loftily expounded in his Gospel the theology of the inexpressible and eternal birth of the Son and Word of God the Father. It is for this cause that an eagle-a symbol of the Holy Spirit, as Saint Irenaeus says-is depicted in his icon, for this was one of the four symbolic living creatures that the Prophet Ezekiel saw (Ezek. 1:10).

We are seeking to create and support sustainable networks of contact and friendship between our two traditions. The main topic of this year's conference will be, "Our Common Roots," focusing on Jesus Christ as expressed in Scripture, the Nicene Creed, and our differing traditions.

### **Quadratos of the 70 – September 21**

On September 21, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we celebrate the Leavetaking of the Elevation of the Holy Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. On this day, we also commemorate the holy, glorious and all-laudable Apostle Quadratos of the Seventy.

#### Verses

Since in no fashion would he offer his worship to stones, The unwise people cast stones at worshipful Quadratos. On the twenty-first, Quadratos won a glorious a crown.



He preached the Gospel in Athens, and was at first bishop in Athens after St. Publius, and then in the city of Magnesia. Quadratos was considered a "morning star among the clouds," shining forth the light of Christ to the Hellenes in the midst of their dark paganism and evil practices. But darkness always hates the light, and the pagans hated holy Quadratos. They first stoned him, and then imprisoned him, leaving him without bread until his holy soul left his body and entered into the Kingdom of Christ his God in the year 130. Before that, Quadratos wrote a defense of Christianity and gave it to the pagan Emperor Hadrian, who was so moved that he decreed that Christians should not be persecuted

without special cause.

On this day, we also commemorate the Prophet Jonah; and the uncovering of the relics of Demetrios, bishop of Rostov. By their intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
